

OAUG Member Snapshot: Basheer Khan

In this issue of *OAUG Insight* magazine, the spotlight is placed on OAUG Associate member, Basheer Khan, not only because of his extensive participation in the Oracle Applications Users Group (OAUG), but his involvement throughout the Oracle community at large. His leadership and the active role he has played with both groups has enabled the OAUG to more effectively serve its members and helped further connect Oracle with its customers.

Within the OAUG, Khan is chairman of the Geo/SIG Committee, founder and chairman of the OAUG Web Services SIG, vice chairman of the Southwest Oracle Applications Users

Group and is agenda chair for the OAUG Forum at COLLABORATE 06: Technology and Applications Forum for the Oracle Community.

Additionally, he is a member of the Membership Committee, represents the OAUG on the J2EE SIG Steering Committee and has served on the OAUG Conference Committee since 2003. He is a frequent speaker at Oracle-related functions, including OAUG conferences and Oracle OpenWorld, and has had multiple papers published on Oracle Applications. For his outstanding contributions to the OAUG, Khan was named OAUG Member of the Year in 2003.

Khan also interacts closely with Oracle

Strategy and Product Development teams to understand the current Oracle Fusion technologies, as well as offer feedback for its future development. He is constantly invited to and attends some of Oracle’s first internal training sessions. He also participates on several early adopter programs.

In addition to his functional expertise in various modules of Oracle Applications 11i, his technical expertise includes Oracle Fusion Architecture, Oracle Fusion Middleware, Oracle BPEL Process Manager 10g, Oracle Business Activity Monitor (BAM), Oracle JDeveloper 10g, Oracle 10g Application Server (10gAS), including Oracle Portal & Discoverer 10g,

Oracle Designer & Developer 10g, Oracle Warehouse Builder 10g, and Oracle 10g Database, including Grid Control 10g.

Khan is managing partner of Irvine, Calif.-based Innowave Technology, a company he founded to focus on using Oracle Fusion technology with the Oracle E-Business suite, JD Edwards and PeopleSoft applications. Innowave Technology also specializes in Web services and Business Process Integration. His company is also a member of the OAUG Fusion Council Steering Committee, which plays a lead role in interacting with Oracle representatives to develop Oracle’s new Fusion applications.

Khan is currently involved with a major mobile virtual network operating company, having successfully completed deploying 13 Oracle modules, including data conversion, in



just 90 days. He now begins the second phase of the Oracle Applications implementation project, which involves integrating Oracle Applications with business partners using Oracle BPEL technology. He is also involved with a major automated banking solution provider to evaluate and develop a legacy migration solution using Oracle Fusion Middleware. Prior to forming Innowave Technology, Khan held multiple consulting positions, including vice president of consulting, vice president of product marketing and director of consulting for several other prominent technology firms.

Khan received his bachelor’s degree in mathematics from the University of Madras, India, and completed his post-graduate studies in computer science and application in the College of Engineering of Anna University in Madras, India. In addition, he serves on the Board of Directors of New Horizon, a K-6 school in Irvine, Calif. An avid golfer and tennis player, Khan resides in Irvine with his wife and two children.
